ty's startup activities. While event organizers expect to see plenty of new entrepreneurs, they also anticipate. a strong turnout of existing businesses seeking to grow, as well as those who want to support local startups through time and financial investment.

We want to offer a new kind of business support through 'acceleration," said EDALC executive director Caroline Bauman. "We are reaching out to local innovators to create a network that will benefit and strengthen our economy."

The event will also feature five-minute pitches from Willamette Valley startup companies, as well as presentations by seasoned angel investors and RAIN ex-

ecutives.
